The History of Kosovo Police

On 6th of September 1999, The OSCE Mission in Kosovo opened the Police School and started training candidates for members of the Kosovo Police in order to create a modern police force that will return confidence in law enforcement and efficiently implement the principles of carrying out police duties in cooperation with the community. The first generation of candidates for this service started training at the center on 6th of September 1999.

This generation enumerated 176 members, who successfully completed the training and began exercising police activities throughout the territory of Kosovo, as the first police officers of this service.

Kosovo for the first time in its history, with the help of the international factor, established the Police in accordance with the national structure of the population in Kosovo. Duties, responsibilities and functions of the local police established under the authority of UNMIK were gradually transferred from 15 June 2002. The institutional

support to Kosovo Police Service was added with the establishment of the Ministry of Internal Affairs on 25th of December, 2005. The Kosovo Police Service was established on the basis of a democratic and professional police, an open and equal service for all those interested in becoming members of this service. Training at the Kosovo Police School is a high standard training, including patrol duties, defense tactics, use of force, first aid, police code of ethics, applicable legislation in Kosovo, crime investigation, evidence collection and the method of interviews, democratic politics and the focus on the credibility of the rules of democratic law, the use of firearms, forensics and evidences, traffic control etc.

After successfully completing the training at the Kosovo Police School, training that has been extended continuously and it is now 22 weeks, members of this service continue with the field training program at police stations with certified trainers. This training has also been extended continuously and is now 2

years until police officers become independent. During recruitment, efforts are made to select men and women from various regions, who reflect Kosovo's ethnic and cultural diversity. From 1999 to 2010 Kosovo Police operated according to the organizational structure designed by international and local staff and in 2012 there was finally drafted the organizational structure of the Kosovo Police approved by the Minister of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Kosovo. Activities under the current organizational structure of the Kosovo Police are coordinated at two levels of organization: the central and local level (including the regional one). The General Directorate of Police is the central level responsible for the entire Republic of Kosovo. The local level includes the Regional Police Directorates, responsible for the regions composed of designated municipalities, police stations responsible for local police in each municipality and police substations - responsible for local police within certain areas of a municipality. Following the declaration of Kosovo's





independence on 17th of February 2008, new circumstances were created for the establishment of the institutions of the Republic of Kosovo, and in this context the creation of the Police of the Republic of Kosovo. Kosovo Police established professional capacities in prevention, investigation

of crime, public safety and security, according to circumstances and situations created, based on the vision, mission and values of this service, will be fulfilled by being committed and responsible, communicative and transparent, impartial and serious in performing duties always serving

the community. Kosovo Police pays attention to strengthening cooperation with local and international institutions and aims at membership in regional and international organizations. One of the key elements of co-operation is the expansion of existing contacts as well as the building of new contacts.



MISSION, VISION AND VALUES OF KOSOVO POLICE

Mission

To provide security and services to all persons in Kosovo based on the law, best practices and standards of democratic policing.

Kosovo Police will fulfill its mission by:

- Providing public security (security of life and property);
- Protecting human rights and freedoms;
- Cooperating with the community and institutions;
- Controlling and supervising the border;
- Improving the performance of the organization;
- Preventing and combating organized crime, corruption and other forms of criminal activity.

Vision

“Professional Police, well-trained, well-equipped, efficient in providing safety, in law enforcement, in prevention of crime, being an example in the region, always supportive and loyal to the community.

Values

Leadership: each officer is responsible to be an example and with personal commitment regardless the work position.

- **Service Orientation:** each officer contributes to the quality of life to the community he serves.
- **Integrity:** we will work with fairness, honesty and sincerity, always based on the highest ethical and moral standards.
- **Dedication:** attentive and pro-active in the organization and community, self-motivated and creative.
- **Teamwork:** Teamwork is essential to success. In the team there should be involved officers as well as community, in order to achieve and meet strategic objectives.

STRATEGIC AND SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

1. Providing public safety and strengthening cooperation with citizens;
2. Preventing and combating organized crime and corruption, serious crimes as well as terrorism;
3. Control and supervision of the state border;
4. Advancing human resources management;
5. Standardization of physical, technical and information technology infrastructure.

Department of Operations

The mission of the Operations Department is the professional, ethical and legal implementation of the duties and powers of the Police, while patrolling, investigating and performing other police activities, dedicated to serving the citizens, maintaining order, preventing and detecting unlawful actions as well as their perpetrators.

The Department of Operations supports and helps the General Police Directorate in achieving strategic goals and objectives for the organization. In this respect, this authority implements and makes decisions, orders planning, manages police operations, requires specific activities and tasks for the subordinate units at central and local level, cooperates and coordinates with other security institutions in specific operations of general security.

The Operations Department ensures the proper implementation of general police powers and the fulfillment of the strategic objectives of the Kosovo Police, namely:

1. Protecting the life, property and providing security for everyone
2. Preventing the fundamental rights and freedoms of everyone
3. Preventing danger to the citizens and maintaining public order and safety
4. Preventing and detecting criminal offenses and their perpetrators
5. Supervising and controlling traffic safety
6. Treating all citizens equally regardless of race, color, religion, gender and age
7. Performing functions of assistance and services to citizens
8. Providing assistance during natural disasters and in other emergencies.



The Division of Public Safety has in its structure the Directorate for Operational Planning and Assessment and the Directorate of Community Police and Prevention.



Directorate of Operational Planning and Assessment

This directorate is responsible for operational planning and coordination of all police units within this department, drafting police operational plans and orders for specific cases, managing and overseeing different situations, as well as drafting operational procedures that should comply with applicable laws and regulations. The primary task of the subordinate units of this department is to protect public order and peace, to prevent and combat criminality of all kinds, to cooperate closely with citizens and other relevant factors, etc.




Directorate of Community Police and Crime Prevention

Directorate of Community Police and Crime Prevention in the KP Organizational Structure is located in the Operations Department, respectively in the Division of Public Safety. The genesis of police actions for the community in terms of the philosophical concept of “Community Policing” begins in 2001-2002. The organizational structure of that time was to have at least one police officer in each police station and, where needed, two or three police officers, depending on the number of population in that area of responsibility. In the years that followed, the Kosovo Police increasingly develops and shapes its activity and develops, advances the philosophical and practical concept of “Community Policing”, developing its approach

through numerous trainings with the community and adapting its activities, based on the saying “Police are the People and the People are the Police”. The vision and mission of this directorate is: to design, develop, implement and draft strategic policies with the aim of extending “community-oriented policing actions” in building and advancing partnership with community, developing co-operation with the aim of identifying, and solving problems, and concerns of the community that are related to the life and well-being of the citizens.

DPBP has three sectors within it: The Sector for Programs and Projects, The Sector of Juvenile Delinquency and The Sector for Cooperation with Security Forums.

SPECIAL INTERVENTION UNIT

Special Intervention Unit, is an elite unit, trained and skilled to intervene in special police tasks or operations, rated at high or extreme risk. The primary tasks of this unit are: the release or rescue of hostages, the chasing and arresting criminals of high-risk or extreme level, the neutralization of dangerous suspects in cases of use of firearms (active shooters, in progress) where innocent citizens are involved, providing support to the CPU in escorting VIPs with extreme-risk with the Counter-Attack Team.





Unit of Handling of Improvised Explosive Devices

It is an elite unit of Kosovo Police, where as its primary task is: respond to the cases of bomb threats, handling, neutralization and dismantling of all bombs in cases of criminal and terrorist attacks, where the criminal investigation is done by the Police. The investigation after explosion, assistance in reconstructing the explosive, collection and preservation of evidences, anti-terrorist controls where the risk is high and extreme high, technical-operational support for special operations, SIU, CPU and SOU (anti-terrorist controls for protection of VIP-s) public riots, etc.





Special Operations Unit

It is an elite unit of Kosovo Police, where as a primary task of this SOU is to control and manage the crowds, such as: protests, demonstrations, strikes and all public gatherings as well as other tasks such as:

- Arrests and raids of dangerous individuals;
- Secure sporting-cultural events;
- Escort of dangerous suspects
- Secure judicial sessions;
- Implementation of GDP orders in support of units and police stations, where there is any public disorder.





Close Protection Unit

This unit operates within the Division of Specialized Units and in operational level it covers the whole territory of the Republic of Kosovo.

The Close Protection Unit was established at the beginning of 2002. This unit is trained with contemporary standards and as primary duty has the securing of local and international VIP-s. This unit has also the members that carry out extraditions in various countries.





K-9 Special Unit

This unit operate within the Directorate of Special Units.
In the operational level it covers the whole territory of the Republic of Kosovo.

This unit was established in 2002 and is specialized and trained for:

- Detection of narcotics
- Detection of suspected explosives and weapons
- Patrol, tracking, apprehend of suspects, finding of suspected means. K-9 Unit possess different races of official dogs such as: Malinas, German pastor, Spanish Springer, Belgium pastor.



Directorate for Securing Facilities and Personalities



This directorate has the duty to secure the facilities of special importance, such as: facilities of Presidency, Kosovo Assembly, Government and facilities of Embassies accredited in Kosovo.

Unit for Protection of Cultural-religious Heritage

This unit has the duty to secure all the facilities of cultural and religious heritage in the Country. The daily tasks of this Unit include the activities of permanent security in different religious facilities and periodic security of several facilities.



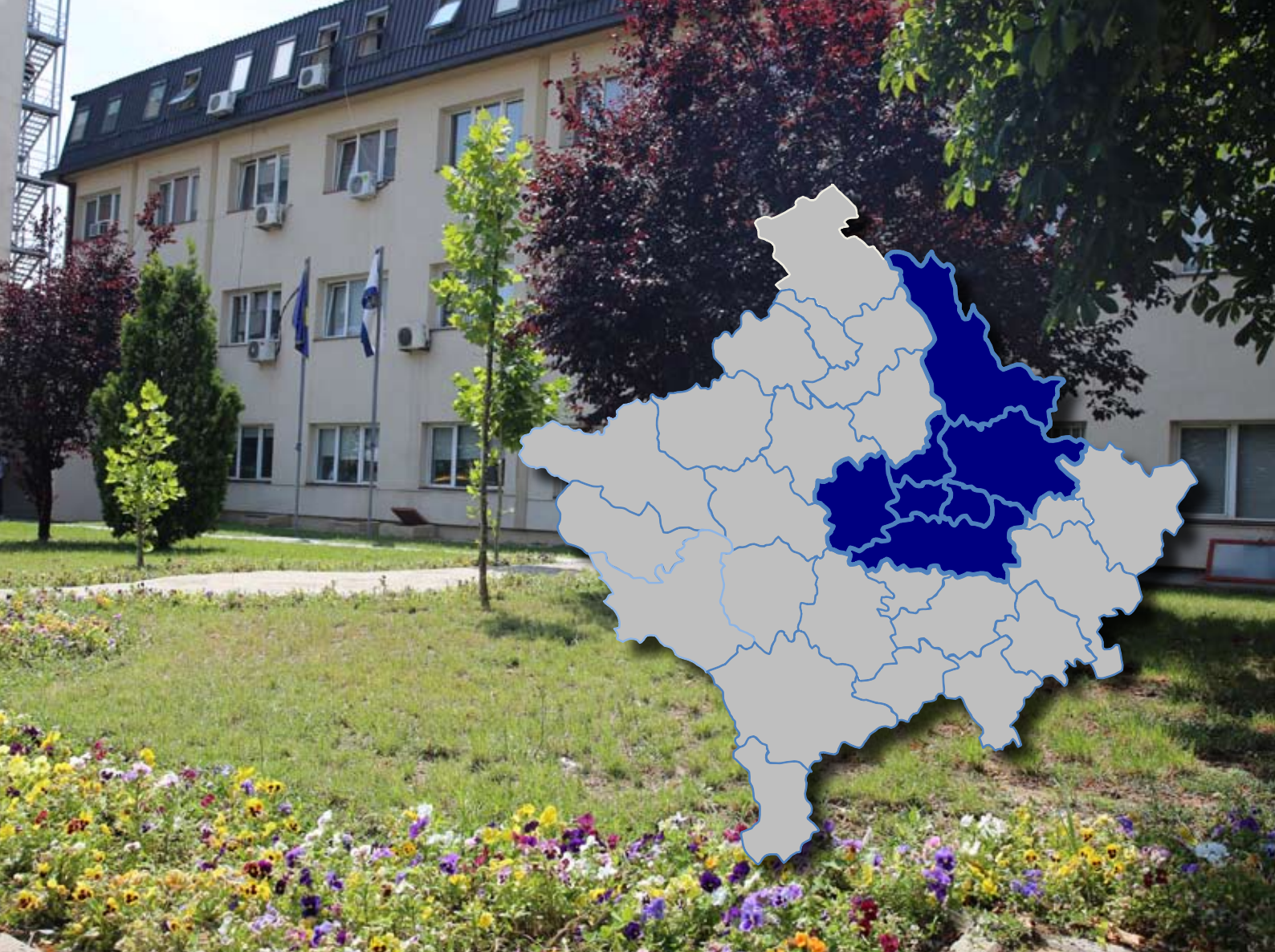


DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC DEPARTMENT

Kosovo Police (KP) provide road traffic safety through its specialized units, which are coordinated by the Road Traffic Department. This department operates under the umbrella of the Operations Department and consist of two Directorates in central level: The Directorate for Road Traffic Safety and Supervision and the Directorate for Prevention in Road Traffic Safety in local level. Unit for motorcycles operate within the RTRU, in the period of summer season from 15th of March – 15th of November, in accordance with the operations standards with motorcycles. Upon the release of the Kosovo highway in circulation, there was created the Unit for Controlling Highways, which operate within the Road Traffic Department. All the units of Road Traffic Department have the duty to implement the road traffic law and other laws into force,

as well as the supervision and safety of road traffic. Investigation about the accidents with serious injuries or deaths within the urban and non-urban areas. Patrols that aim the prevention of accidents in road traffic into all roads of the country, orientation and safety as well as the escort of local and international VIP-s.





Regional Directorate of Police - Prishtina

RDP of Pristina has a territorial extension of 2,140.82 km² and a multi-ethnic population of 470,583 inhabitants. Within the Prishtina DRP operates police stations, 'Center' in Prishtina, 'South' in Prishtina, 'North' in Prishtina, Fushë Kosovë, Obiliq, Podujeva, Lipjan, Gračanica, and Regional Traffic Unit with location in Fushe Kosove. The number of employees in this RDP is 1100 police officers. As a characteristic of this RDP is the fact that Pristina is the capital of the Republic of Kosovo. Prishtina RDP covers the territory of seven municipalities: Prishtina, Podujeva, Drenas, Lipjan, Fushë Kosovë, Obiliq and Graçanicë. Prishtina, as the capital of the Republic of Kosovo, is the centre of diplomatic, cultural and artistic developments of

all who live in Kosovo. In the responsibility area of RDP-Prishtina are the facilities of special importance, such as: Parliament of the Republic of Kosovo, Presidency, Government with all ministries, KFOR Command, General Directorate of Police, KSF Command, Embassies and the diplomatic offices, the Ombudsperson, the Constitutional Court and other courts, the State Prosecution, non-governmental organizations, University Hospital Center, Prishtina International Airport, power plants, religious sites, important cultural and scientific facilities such as: National and University Library, University of Prishtina, Kosovo Academy of Sciences and Arts, National Theatre, Youth and Sports Palace, City of Students with all Student Dormitories etc.



Regional Directorate of Police - Gjilan

Regional Police Directorate in Gjilan, within its structure, has the police stations in Gjilan, Kamenica and Viti, Novobërdë, Kllokot, Partesh and Ranilluk and substations in the villages of Zhegër, Pozhoran and Muqivërc. The total number of KP employees in this DRP is over 600 police officers and civil staff. The area of responsibility of Gjilan / Gjilane DRP is 1505 square kilometres and has approximately 188188 inhabitants, with the largest number of ethnic Albanians, Serbs and other nationalities, such as Turks, Bosnians, Roma etc.



Regional Directorate of Police - Pejë

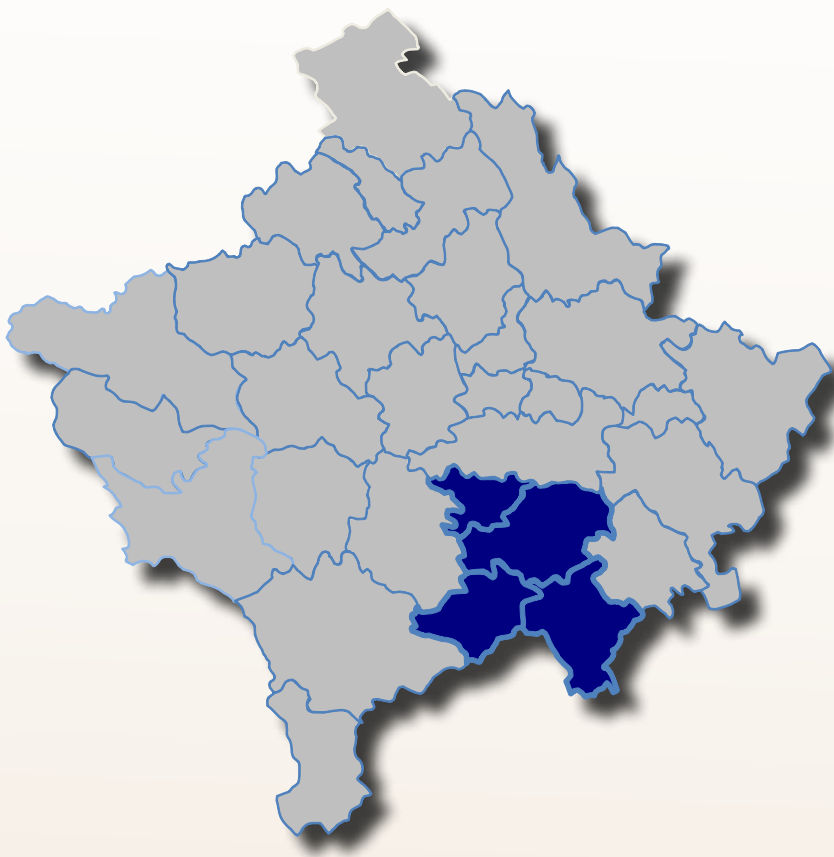
The Regional Police Directorate in Peja, in its structuring has the police stations in Peja, Istog, Klina, Deçan, Junik, and substations in the villages of Vitimirica and Gorozhdec. The RDP Peja covers 1735 square kilometres, 280 villages and approximately 371,770 inhabitants, most of them of ethnic Albanian as well as other ethnicities, such as Serbs, Bosnians, Roma etc.





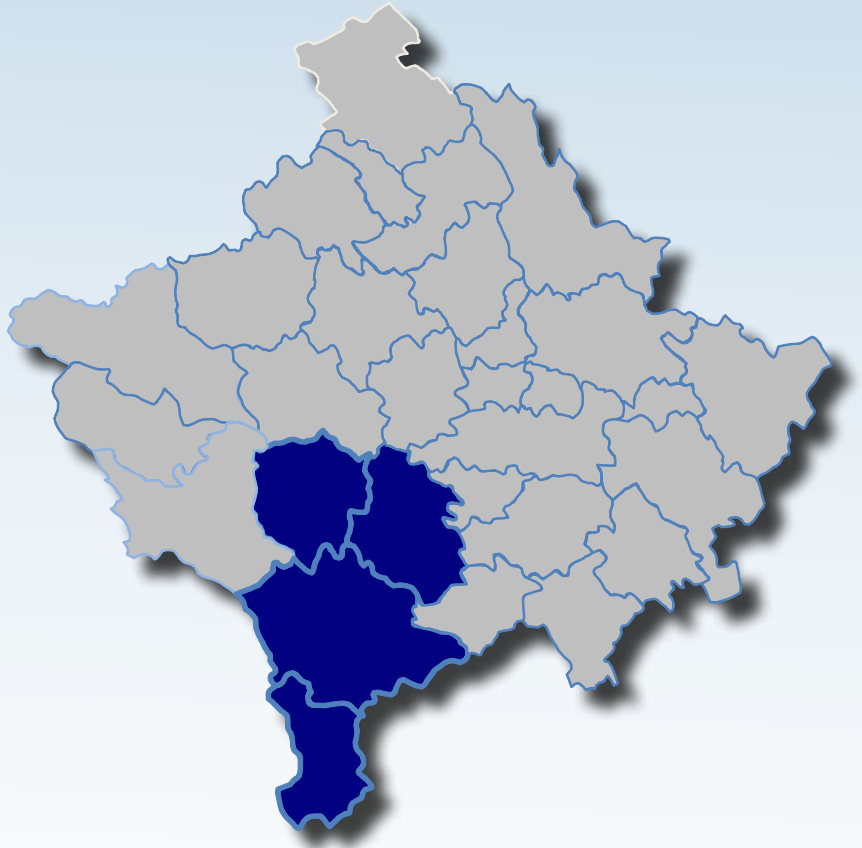
Regional Directorate of Police - Ferizaj

The responsibility area of RDP-Ferizaj has a surface of 1018 km and 185,695 inhabitants. Within this directorate there operate the police stations of Ferizaj, Shtime, Kaçanik, Shtërpcë, Hani i Elezit. Characteristic of this directorate is that in the responsibility area is the main road that is characterized by the biggest traffic in the country, the road linking the two capitals Prishtina and Skopje.



Regional Directorate of Police - Prizren

The responsibility area of this directorate is 2,024 km² with a population of about 387,828 inhabitants of mixed ethnic Albanian, Turkish, Bosnian and Serbian: RAE community, Goran etc. This mass of population is spread over six cities covering a total of 233 villages. Within the Police stations in Prizren, there operate the police station of Malisheva, Rahovec, Suhareka, Mamusha, Dragash and Substations in the village of Sreskë, Zhur, Mushtisht, Krushevo, Regional Traffic Unit.





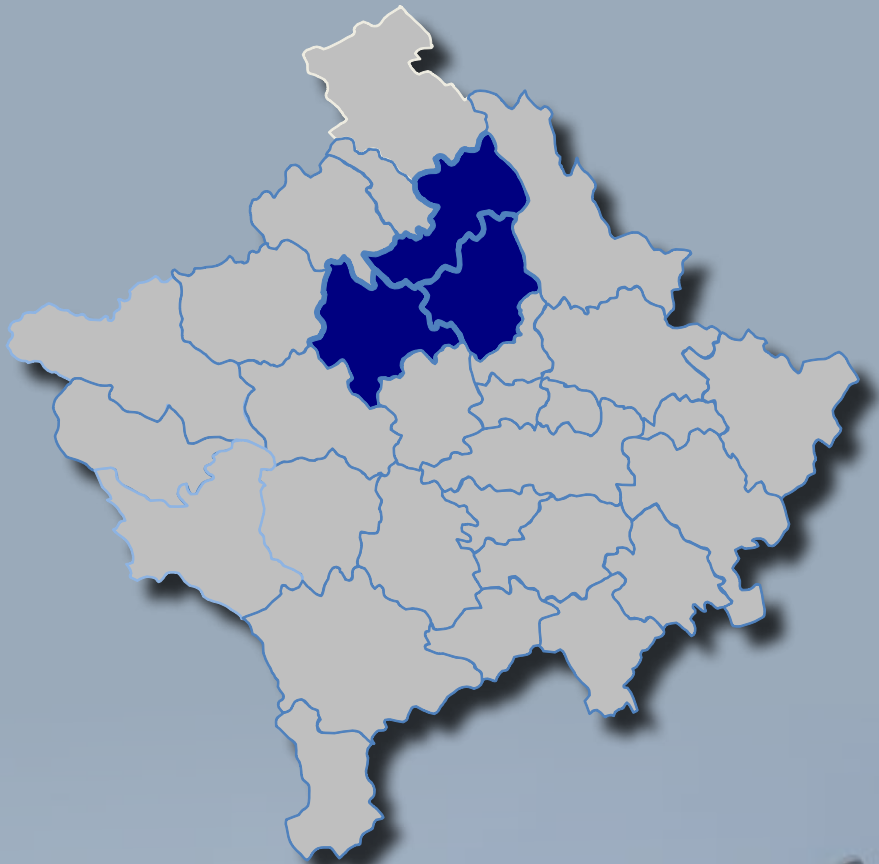
Regional Directorate of Police – Gjakova

The responsibility area of the Regional Directorate in Gjakova or its territory is defined according to the division that the judiciary has and this includes the municipalities of Gjakova, Rahovec and Malisheva. This region is in the southwestern part of Kosovo and has its own specifications starting from the size of 1109 km², with 165 villages and three cities, with about 205,377 inhabitants, with its geographical position and facilities of particular importance. This regional directorate has under the responsibility the following police stations: Police Station of Gjakova, Rahovec and Malisheva.



Regional Directorate of Police - Mitrovica- South

This directorate has an area of responsibility of about 1050 km², with a total of 192600 inhabitants and covers the territory of three municipalities: Mitrovica South, Skenderaj and Vushtrri. Within the RDP-Mitrovica there are three police stations: Police Station Mitrovica South, Vushtrri and Skenderaj, while three police substations are in: Syriganë, Frashër and Prelluzhë.





Regional Directorate of Police - Mitrovica - North

This directorate in its structure has four police stations and three police substations. Mitrovica-North Police Station, Zubin Potok, Zvecan, Leposavic and police substations in Çabër, Bistrica and Lip. This directory has four cities and 176 villages. It has population of mixed ethnicities.



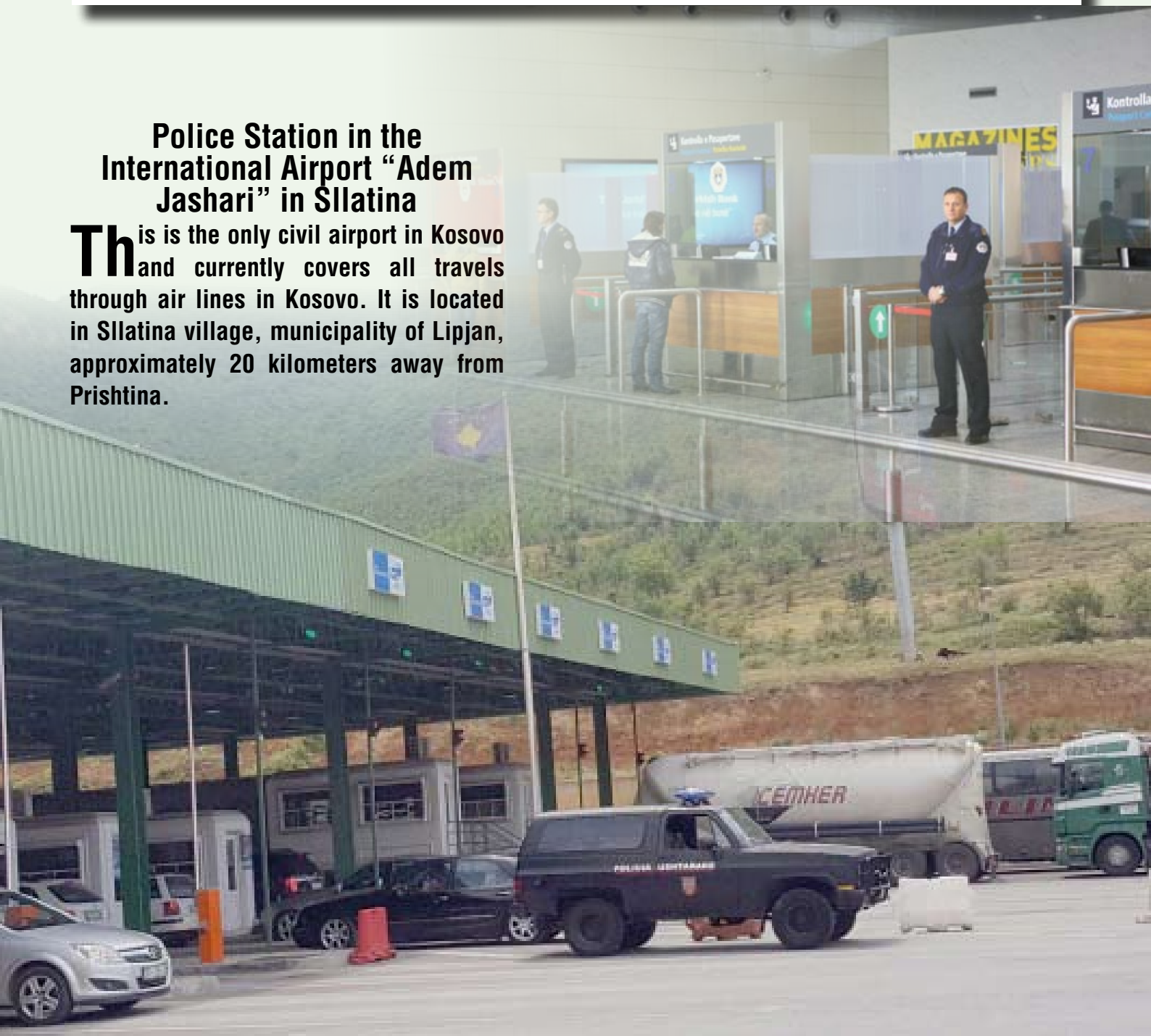
Border Department

In this department are structured two divisions, five directorates and airport police station. In the entire Kosovo border line there are 16 border crossing points in total, 13 are the main task of this department is the provision of working 24/7 and other three are temporary crossing points. Main task of this department is

the securing the integrity of state border, prevention, detection and investigation of the trans border crime. Within the division of border surveillance and control are these directorates: Regional Directorate North, Regional Directorate East, Regional Directorate West and Airport Police Station.

Police Station in the International Airport “Adem Jashari” in Sllatina

This is the only civil airport in Kosovo and currently covers all travels through air lines in Kosovo. It is located in Sllatina village, municipality of Lipjan, approximately 20 kilometers away from Prishtina.





Regional Directorate North

This directorate is responsible for the border crossing points: Merdare, Mutivoda, Jarinje and Bërrnjak and controlling the green line border area, within these stations. All these border points are in the border with the Republic of Serbia. This regional directorate has its base located in Lluzhan municipality of Podujeva.

Regional Directorate East

This directorate is responsible for the border crossing points: Dheu i Bardhë, Muqibabë, Gllloboqicë and border crossing point Hani i Elezit. This directorate is responsible for controlling a part of the green line between the Republic of Serbia and border line with Macedonia. This directorate has its headquarters located in Kaçanikut.

Regional Directorate West

This directorate is located in the city of Gjakova and covers the area border responsibility with Albania, Monte Negro and one part with Macedonia. This directorate is responsible for border crossing points at, Vërmica, Qafë Prush, Qafë Morinë, crossing point at Kulla.

The Directorate of Operations

The Directorate of Operations at the Border Department is located in Prishtina and conducts all the operational planning and assessments in this department related to Border Police.

The Directorate of Migration and Foreigners

This directorate continuously works to prevent the illegal migration in our country, also it registers all foreigners coming to Kosovo and applying for staying permit.

Investigation Department

INVESTIGATION DEPARTMENT – has the mission of preventing and investigating criminality, detecting and investigating perpetrators of criminal offences by gathering and presenting facts, evidences proving the guilt or innocence of persons suspected for criminal offenses, as well as the putting perpetrators in front of justice. Socially complex criminal phenomena such as organized crime, corruption, serious crimes, violent extremism and terrorism require multidimensional-disciplinary approaches, and therefore the approach of the Department of Investigation is multidimensional.

The Investigations Department pays particular attention to capacity building through training of police officers, equipment upgrading and cooperation between local and international authorities for information exchange, the merging of criminal cases, confiscation of assets obtained through criminal offenses, arrest of suspects, the destruction of criminal groups and the provision of evidences to the judiciary bodies.

The Investigation Department bases its work on the following specific objectives:

1. Inter-institutional and international co-operation and coordination;
2. Preventing and combating organized crime (narcotics trafficking, trafficking in human beings, migrant smuggling, weapons smuggling and cybercrime);
3. Preventing radicalization and violent extremism, conducting proactive and reactive investigations;
4. Preventing and combating economic, financial and corruption crimes as well as;
5. Improving the efficiency and quality of investigative work by police investigators.

Within the Investigation Department there are structured:

The Division of Crime Investigation, the Division against Organized Crime as well as nine directorates

The special focus of this department is the investigation of criminal offenses of the nature of serious crimes, organized crime, economic crime and corruption, cybercrime and terrorism.

Within the Division of Crime Investigation there are:

Directorate for Serious Crimes Investigation

This directorate investigates cases where specialized investigations are required which cannot be treated at regional level or at level of investigations within stations.

Directorate of Investigation of Economic Crimes and Corruption

This directorate investigates all cases related to criminal offenses against the economy and corruption. The investigative scope of this directorate is related to criminal offenses against financial crimes, abuse of official duty, corruption, etc.

Directorate against Terrorism

This Directorate monitors and investigates all activities related to the attack on Kosovo's legal order as well as terrorism.

Directorate of Intelligence and Analysis (DIA)

This directorate deals with crime trend analysis and supplies all other police units with information on various criminal persons or groups.

Directorate of Forensics

This directorate deals with the collection of evidences in various cases at the scene and responds to cases where forensics expertise is required.

Directorate of Investigation of Organized Crime

This directorate investigates organized crime cases and at the same time cooperates with all other police units in investigating cases of this nature.

Directorate of Investigation of Trafficking in Narcotics

Investigates cases of trafficking in narcotics throughout the territory of the country

Directorate for Investigation of Trafficking in Human Beings

This directorate investigates cases of human trafficking and the identification of trafficked victims.

Directorate for Investigation Support

This directorate supports all directorates, other police units with information and police plans in the area of locating persons considered to be with high risk, who are wanted by the Kosovo Police.

Department of Supporting Services

Within this department there are: Directorate of Information Technology, Directory of Logistics, Directorate of Budget and Finances, Directorate of Facility Management and the Procurement Directorate. The task of this department is to provide all support services to the Kosovo Police, with particular emphasis on the sustainable provision of all budgetary, financial and procurement services. It also deals with providing information and communication technology infrastructure services, building, renovating and maintaining police facilities as well as providing the necessary logistics to ensure the sustainability of KP activities.



Human Resources Department

The duty of this department is to sustainably build the human resources of the Kosovo Police and to develop them through trainings, educational and training development programs, including the recruitment, employment, training, development, participation in work relation, health and safety, fair treatment of employees. The HR department takes care of equal opportunities, diversity, career development and promotion, identifying staffing needs, managing personnel records or data, monitoring the practical training program at all levels as part of the career development process and assessment, leaves and other absences at work, transfer and appointment of police personnel, personnel files, discipline, dismissal and resignations.





International Law Enforcement Cooperation Unit

International Law Enforcement Cooperation Unit - ILECU has been established in 2011 with a decision of the Government of Kosovo, followed by the agreement between MIA, MJ, State Prosecutor and Ministry of Finances, and later there were established our contact point in each ministry and this cooperation continues today.

ILECU has in its composition INTERPOL, EUROPOL, FAST, PKA and police liaison officers. ILECU, in its scope has as a duty the

international police cooperation, through exchange of information, with the aim prevention, investigation and detection of criminal offences prosecuted ex officio, other countries and various police organizations, such as: INTERPOL, EUROPOL, SELEC and various international networks, such as: ENFAST, FFP, OLAF etc. With the aim of increasing international cooperation, Kosovo so far has signed 82 international agreements which cover the police cooperation with 19 states and various international organizations.



Office of Information and Public Relations

Kosovo Police has also paid a great deal of attention to communicating with the public. Within the KP there is a central information office, which is structured in the cabinet of the Director General of the Kosovo Police.

Information offices at the regional level also operate within each regional directorate. The main task of the information office is to communicate with the public through the media, informing the public about Police activities and the security situation in the country. The central office covers the activity of the General Police and activities involving two or more regional directorates, while the regional offices cover the activity of the respective regional directorate. Thanks to the work of the Kosovo Police Information Offices, it has been several times declared as the most transparent institution and the information officers have been given the award the 'Best Spokesperson in Kosovo'.
