SOME TIPS FOR YOUR SAFETY

SAFETY MEASURES

Home burglaries and thefts are the most common acts committed if your house or apartment is vacated for a longer time, due to vacation or any travel. Some prevention measures for you to consider:





- Do not tell everyone that you are traveling anywhere;
- Do not leave money and valuables at home, deposit them in your vault at the bank;
- Write down or photograph the serial number of expensive items, e.g. household goods;
- Do not place the key to the house or apartment under the carpet at the entrance to the apartment/house or under flower vases;
- Set exterior lighting such as automatic light switching or sensor lighting

HOW TO PREVENT CAR THEFTS AND THEFTS IN CARS:

- When parking, do not leave the car documents inside;
- Set on the alarm and locking device on the steering wheel of the car;
- Do not leave valuables in the car where they are visible;
- Always close all car doors;
- Do not park in places with insufficient lighting or in isolated places;
- When parking your car overnight, activate the alarm if you have one.





FEWER THE WEAPONS, LESS TRAGEDY!



FIREARM SHOOTING AT FAMILY PARTIES IS DANGEROUS. THEREFORE:

- -Do not let anyone open fire at your family party, report to the Police;
- -If you notice someone in possession of a firearm, report it to the Police;
- -Every gunshot endangers the citizens, every bullet can hit someone.

Do not spoil the family party!
Celebrate with your heart, not with firearms!

CAUSING FIRE

Fires are a real danger! Merasures to consider:





- Do not throw lighted cigarette butts in nature;
- Do not light a cigarette while in bed;
- Do not light grass fires, near forests;



- Regularly check electrical installations;
- Do not light the grill near forests;
- Keep the matches/fire away from children.
- Do not throw away lit cigarettes from the car.
