The arrest, neutralization and expulsion of terrorists were a clear message that the state will not tolerate terrorist acts that undermine national security and security of citizens. The action was an inspiring example of cooperation, courage and professionalism that should continue to characterize the work of Police.

In times of challenges, the Police remains committed to protecting constitutional order and public security, to protecting public and private property, despite the risks and sacrifices, police officers continue to be on the front lines of the fight against terrorism, crime and elements that seek to destabilize the country. Their duty is not just a profession, but a sacred mission to protect the freedom, country, life and property of our citizens.

As we remember the hero Bunjaku who fell in the line of duty, we should all reflect on the vital role that the Police play in our society. Only by standing united and fulfilling our duties can we protect the constitutional order and the values of our shared democracy.




The meeting concluded with the commitment of the two main representatives of the two like-sister institutions to further increase cooperation in the future, expanding into new areas of common interest.







KOSOVO IN THE TOP 15 SAFEST COUNTRIES IN THE WORLD: THE SUCCESS OF THE KOSOVO POLICE IN ENSURING PUBLIC SAFETY



Kosovo's ranking as the 12th safest country in the world is a testament to the commitment of Kosovo Police and strong cooperation with citizens to build a safe and stable society.

Kosovo has been ranked as the 12th safest country in the world according to the Gallup report for 2023, an important achievement that reflects the work of the Kosovo Police and the cooperation with citizens and state institutions. KOSOVO POLICE ESTABLISHES SPORTS ASSOCIATION WITH CLUBS IN VARIOUS DISCIPLINES

- 6. Shooting, registered in the Municipality of Vushtrri,
- 7. Athletics, in the process of registration in the Municipality of Pristina and
- 8. Basketball, in the process of registration in the Municipality of Pristina.

Based on the statute of the aforementioned clubs, all members of KP, civilian staff employed in the KP and their family members have the right of representation in these clubs.

TERRORIST ATTACKS IN NORTH OF KOSOVO: WEAPONS AND EXPLOSIVES SEIZED BY POLICE

In the last six months, Kosovo's institutions have been challenged by terrorist attacks, which have seriously jeopardized security and order in the country. In the period June - November 2024, 10 attacks with explosive devices were recorded, mainly in Serb-majority municipalities including attacks to Kosovo's citizens, institutions and critical infrastructure.

KOSOVO POLICE, FOLLOWING REPORTS FROM FINANCIAL MONITORING INSTITUTIONS...

Kosovo Police, following reports from financial monitoring institutions, such as the Financial Intelligence Unit and the Central Bank of Kosovo, together with the Kosovo Tax Administration, based on the authorization of the competent prosecutor



Kosovo Police on 03.11.2024 conducted a police operation named "Kalaja" which was carried out in a shopping center in the Peja-Deçan Highway, which resulted in the arrest of two suspects of the RKS. After the arrests were made, it was continued with a raid, where about 100 kilograms of narcotics suspected to be marijuana were found, the amount in various state, some ready-made and the other part in the form of plants, dried, and it was seized. The plants were cultivated near a house and the quantity was 213 plants, the police operation also continued with a raid in the village of Barilevë in Pristina, where a small amount of suspected narcotics was found. The competent prosecutor, as well as Forensics, arrived at the scene and the case remains to be investigated by the competent anti-drug units and the competent prosecution office.

Terrorist attacks in north of Kosovo: Weapons and explosives seized by Police

In the last six months, Kosovo's institutions have been challenged by terrorist attacks, which have seriously jeopardized security and order in the country. In the period June - November 2024, 10 attacks with explosive devices were recorded, mainly in Serb-majority municipalities, including attacks to Kosovo's citizens, institutions and critical infrastructure.

One of the most serious attacks occurred on 29.11.2024, when a terrorist attack hit the water and energy supply infrastructure in the village of Varage, Zubin Potok, causing considerable damage and endangering the water and energy supply to many areas. Kosovo Police, in cooperation with the Special Prosecution Office, undertook massive operations to arrest suspects, conducting searches in 10 locations and arresting eight suspects for committing terrorist attacks. As a result, hazardous weapons, such as hand-held rocket launchers, grenades, automatic weapons, ammunition, and other evidence related to these acts of violence have been seized. The Police invites citizens to cooperate in providing information for crime prevention and keeping order in the Republic of Kosovo.









Kosovo Police, in fighting against criminal activities, in coordination with the Basic Prosecution Office of Prizren, on 31.10.2024, carried out a large-scale police operation in Prizren and Suhareka, which was spread over 6 different locations, where 6 suspects for involvement in the criminal offenses of 'usury' and 'coercion' were arrested. During the implementation of the police operation, a court order was carried out, where in the residences of the suspects there wereseized: 20 residential and business units, 5 vehicles, 5 weapons and ammunition of different calibers, documentation, such as: contracts, pre-contracts, cash, digital evidence, and bank accounts of the suspects were blocked. The suspects have managed to illegally benefit from the victim, large amounts of money as well as immovable and movable property as a form of interest from the usury activity, the value of which exceeds 1 million euros. Regarding the case, the suspects have been detained for 48 hours by a prosecutor's decision.

Kosovo Police, following reports from financial monitoring institutions, such as the Financial Intelligence Unit and the Central Bank of Kosovo, together with the Kosovo Tax Administration, based on the authorization of the competent prosecutor, conducted a police operation in six locations in four municipalities in north part Kosovo, namely: the socalled Treasury of the Postal Savings Bank (Banka Postanske Stedionice) and five of its other branches, which have been operating illegally in this area of Republic of Kosovo.

The purpose of the police operation was to establish order and legality, where with the authorization of the competent prosecutor six units of the so-called illegal postal savings bank in the north of the country were closed. During this operation, various material evidences were confiscated, such as: money, approximately 1,600,000 euros, 74,700,000 dinars, 19,500 francs, 13,800 US dollars, 40 Australian dollars, as well as other relevant documentation and evidence related to the case





A person arrested after attacking and threatening police officers and KEDS officials





On 18.11.2024, police units from the Regional Police Directorate - Mitrovica North, as part of their regular duties, while assisting officials of the Kosovo Electricity Distribution Company (KEDS) in the installation of electricity meters in the Kroi i Vitakut neighborhood, were threatened by a resident (R.R) born in 1986.

After continuous threats and the attack on police officers, the suspect has been arrested. A police officer received medical treatment after being hit with a hard object. Based on reasonable suspicion, police units raided the person's home and found a significant amount of cryptocurrency production equipment (RIGA) which have been seized and sent to the customs terminal. All actions taken have been reported to the Prosecutor of the case, where after the interview, by decision of the prosecutor, the suspect is sent to detention for 48 hours. The police remains committed to providing services to the entire community without discrimination and will bring all persons who violate the law before the justice system.

Several packs of cigarettes seized at the airport

On 14.12.2024 at about 10:35 after a police operation, in the hall of the Pristina International Airport "Adem Jashari", three male passengers, citizens of the United Kingdom, were observed, who on 13.12.2024 came from London and the same were observed by police officers until they left the airport. As a result of the police work, today the police officers have observed these persons/passengers who had backpacks and other suitcases and the control staff (X -ray) on departure and the customs officers at the airport were informed about it. These three passengers were checked in (X-ray), in the presence of the police and the customs officer, where based on the control device in (X-ray), it was detected that there is a considerable amount of cigarette packs in these suitcases. The same were sent to the Customs offices for further procedures and checks, where after a detailed check of the suitcases it resulted that there were 190 (boxes) of Marlboro cigarettes, which were seized by Kosovo Customs, who were also handed over the case for further action.

A fruitful cooperation between Hospital and University Clinical Service of Kosovo (HUCSK) and Kosovo Police (KP)

The Memorandum of Understanding signed between the Hospital and University Clinical Service of Kosovo (HUCSK) and Kosovo Police (KP), for providing medical and psychological services to police personnel and recruits, began to be implemented since November last year, where the implementation of this memorandum resulted to be extremely successful.

On 03.12.2024, the General Director of Kosovo Police, Colonel Gazmend Hoxha, and the Director of HUCSK, Mr. Ph. Elvir Azizi, signed its continuation, based on the high success of implementation and cooperation.

This success consists in the fact that medical/psychological checks for new KP recruits and systematic checks of KP employees and recruits have been carried out at the Kosovo University Clinical Center (KUKC) and in the regional general hospitals of the Hospital and University Clinical Service of Kosovo (HUCSK), according to the medical criteria determined by the Directorate of Health Services of the General Directorate of Kosovo Police.

The implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding between HUCSK and Kosovo Police has been of immense importance for the police personnel. This memorandum provided health and well-being in the psycho-physical aspect, including:

- Early detection of various diseases,
- Preventing complications of chronic diseases,
- Carrying out professional medical examinations by specialist doctors in various fields,
- Determining and prescribing adequate therapies,
- Performing advanced diagnostic examinations based on relevant indications, such as: magnetic resonance imaging, CT, Echo of the heart and other organ systems, ergometry, etc., coronarography, stents, bypass, etc.

Also, this memorandum has played a key role in the selection of new Kosovo Police recruits, through medical and psychological checks in accordance with medical standards for new KP applicants.

We express our deep gratitude for the comittment and support of all the medical and support staff of the KUKC and the regional hospitals of the HUCSK for their continuous professionalism and dedication shown.



The contribution of KUKC specialist doctors:

cardiologists, invasive cardiologists, endocrinologists, neurologists, psychiatrists, psychologists, biochemists, dermatologists, ophthalmologists, orthopedists, ENT doctors, radiologists, has been exceptional in systematic medical check-ups of KP employees, medical/psychological check-ups of new KP recruits, periodic medical/psychological testing for members of KP Specialized Units.

We also express our gratitude for the hard work of other specialists in the fields of surgery, oncology, physiatry, nuclear medicine, etc., showing an important role in providing quality medical services to Kosovo Police employees.

During the implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding, the liaison office between the HUCSK and Kosovo Police was operationalized, which contributed to the increase in inter-institutional cooperation and providing specialist medical services on time for the needs of police personnel and recruits, based on existing capacities.

Taking into account the work specifics of police officers, which includes high psycho-physical stress, the importance of their role in providing general security in the country, the living conditions and standard of living, as well as the fact that a significant number among them are elderly, maintaining the health of all police personnel and preventing diseases or complications through specialist medical services from the KUKC and regional hospitals of the HUCSK has been and is essential. This directly affects the increase in their efficiency in fulfilling official duties in serving citizens and the Republic of Kosovo.

On o3.12.2024, the General Director of the Kosovo Police, Colonel Gazmend Hoxha, and the Director HUCSK Mr. Ph. Elvir Azizi, signed the extension of the cooperation agreement concluded between Police of the Republic of Kosovo and the Hospital Service of the University Clinic of Kosovo for medical and psychological services for police personnel and recruits, unlimitted, taking into account the results achieved from the highly successful implementation of the existing agreement from November 2023 - November 2024.



USE OF SNOWMOBILE BY KOSOVO POLICE

This topic presents the role and importance of snowmobiles in border police patrol operations, including aspects of security, border control, and prevention of illegal activities in winter conditions. It focuses on the importance of the use of snowmobiles by border police to ensure control and security at borders difficult-to-reach, highlighting the benefits that it offers in difficult winter and mountain conditions. This makes it clear that snowmobile patrol is a key in border protection, especially in remote and isolated regions. Snowmobiles are a very efficient and necessary mean for border police, as they offer high mobility and the ability to operate in difficult winter and mountain conditions. They have a multiple role: from border patrol and prevention of illegal activities to emergency assistance and rescue. Their use can significantly contribute to strengthening security and border protection, ensuring that isolated or difficult areas are monitored and controlled at all times. In general, snowmobiles are usable by any unit that needs to operate in extreme winter and mountain conditions. Their use is very important to ensure speed and mobility in difficult terrain, where transportation by other vehicles is impossible. Snowmobile police patrol is a special form of police patrol that uses special vehicles such as motorcycles of various types, which are equipped to cope with difficult conditions such as snow or other extreme conditions. This type of patrol is common in mountainous areas, in regions with harsh winter conditions, where ordinary vehicles may have difficulty moving due to snow, frost and difficult terrain. Snowmobiles for patrol in snow conditions are designed with special tires and can be equipped with accessories such as tow to pull vehicles or assist in emergency operations, as well as rear lights and sirens for signaling.

They are often used by law enforcement forces to carry out patrols and surveillance of specific areas, often offering greater mobility than conventional vehicles. In addition, the motorcycles are also useful for rescue and assistance in cases of accidents or emergency situations in areas where first aid is vital. In some countries, such as in the winter regions of Northern Europe or in Canada, snowmobile patrols are used to ensure order and security in isolated areas. While in Kosovo, mainly the border police use them for patrols in mountainous-hilly areas and in important places where there are ski centers such as in Brezovice, Boge, Brod and other places, knowing that the border of the Republic of Kosovo with neighboring countries is almost entirely mountainous-hilly. Snowmobile patrols can focus on several important aspects of this activity, such as its importance in public safety, the challenges encountered and the technologies used. This article can examine how snowmobile patrols contribute to maintaining order and security in areas that are isolated during the winter, where vehicles cannot move. Concrete examples of the use of snowmobiles to prevent accidents, to help rescue people in emergencies and to monitor areas where illegal activities occur, among the most important was the case of the village of Restelice on February 11, 2012, when a snow avalanche, 10 meters deep and 500 meters wide, hit 15 houses, causing the loss of lives of 10 persons. The role of the Kosovo Border Police was very crucial as it aided all Kosovo institutions by transporting victims, transporting adequate equipment and rescue officials to the scene. In the police press release issued on 23.03.2021 it says: "On 22.03.2021, at about 11:40, Kosovo Police received information that in the Zhurë Mountains several people were encountering difficulties as a result of the snow, they were rescued by snowmobile by the Kosovo Border Police."

CENTRAL POLICE ARCHIVE PRESENTED AT INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE IN SLOVENIA

The Central Archive of Kosovo Police, within the close cooperation with the State Agency of Archives of Kosovo, continuous cooperation with other archives in the region at the professional level, such as: the General Directorate of Archives of Albania, the Directorate of Archives of Turkey, the Directorate of Archives of North Macedonia, etc. From this cooperation, our representatives participate every year in national and international conferences related to cultural heritage, archives, document processing. legislation, international standards, preservation and protection of archival funds, access to archival funds, electronic archives, etc., as during 2023 with participation and presentation of a statement on the Police Archive at the conference organized in North Macedonia in the city of Manastir. The next conference during this year (2024) was organized and held in Slovenia. Kosovo Police, namely the Central Archive, received an official invitation from the Marbor Archive of the State of Slovenia to participate in the annual conference.

In this international conference organized by the Organizing Committee "PAM-Pokrajinski arhiv Maribor" we applied with the topic: "Principles of protection of classified information according to Law no. 08/l-175, and Police Archives". After the professional commission reviewed and approved the topic for presentation of the Central Police Archive, with the support and of DHR and with the approval of the General Director, we participated and represented in this conference held from 15 to 17 May 2024 in Radenc/Maribor. There participated many representatives from the countries of the region and beyond, while from Kosovo, respectively, Kosovo Police in the relevant field of archives there presented by MA. Sami Sallahu, Chief of the Central Archive Sector and Kreshnik Xhemaili, Senior Officer in the Classified Information Unit, General Directorate of Police. The topic in question focused on the presentation and handling of classified information, categories, protection under applicable law, and the Central Archive of the KP.

This presentation was highly appreciated by the organizer and aroused interest among all the participants present from different countries. In addition to the presented topic, what made it special was the fact that the poster was also displayed at all times in the premises where the conference was held. For our organization, we consider that it was of great interest to participate, exchange experiences in gaining new knowledge in the field, based on international standards and changes in legislation that address the problems of archives, electronic archives, their contemporary development, storage of classified information, protection of secret and archival documents, access to information, official documents, etc.


The Law on the Protection of Classified Information No. 08/l-175 defines the basic principles and minimum security standards as a unique system for the protection of classified information related to security interests in the Republic of Kosovo. This law is in line with EU legislation and the Council Decision on the security rules for the protection of EU classified information and is implemented by all (public) institutions exercising executive, legislative and judicial powers, for natural and legal persons. Therefore, classified information in Kosovo is protected by law, while the authorities for the classification of information are the senior heads of state and security and justice institutions. Information classification levels: Information based on content, value and state interest is classified into four levels, the classification retention periods are: "top secret" is stored for 50 years, "secret" for 15 years, "confidential" for 5 years and "restricted" for 1 year.

Information is declassified only when there is no need for further protection, when its disclosure no longer poses a threat to the security of the Republic of Kosovo. Information that must be submitted to the archives is not destroyed, but declassified.

Central Archives at the General Directorate of Kosovo Police

Based on the organizational structure, which operates within the Department of Human Resources/GPD, there are two organizational units: the Archive Unit and the Document Administration Unit, which provide professional and efficient services in the field of document management, recording, protocoling, selection, evaluation, archiving, storage, destruction of (deprecated) documents, as well as the possibility of using or accessing the archival fund in physical and electronic form, in Kosovo Police.

For the functioning of this sector and the provision of necessary services, a legal basis has been created, internal regulations, according to the legislation on archives, such as: Law on Archives No. 08/L-111, Law on Office Work Administration No. 04/L-184 and by-laws, also based on international standards of modern archives. The Archives Sector operates by implementing internal regulations, instructions, Standard Operating Procedures, the list of categories of documents with retention periods, the decision with the "Administrative Codes for the Classification of Official Documents", etc. In addition to the legal infrastructure, appropriate conditions have been created for the storage of documents in a secure environment with modern inventory, mobile metal (special) shelves, monitoring cameras in the Archive/GPD warehouse, which make the archive functional in achieving its objectives. The archival fund and official documentation created and administered in Kosovo Police are protected by law and by-laws. Valuable long-term storage materials are submitted to the Archive Depot as an important part of preserving the written treasure and history of the organization since its establishment, over the years until now. Police archival materials are treated and protected in adequate conditions for the preservation of archival material according to contemporary standards of modern archives.
